THE BINNEY EXHIBITION.

(£16 sterling per annum. Open to students in indigent circumstances, and of exemplary conduct.)

In the year 1858, Miss Binney, eister of the present Visitor, and daughter of the late Rev. Dr. Hibbert Binney, in the name and on behalf of her father's executors, handed over to the Governors certain stock, amounting to \$1,000, to found an Exhibition at King's College, to be called "the Dr. Binney Exhibition," in memory of her said father.

The design of this Scholarship is to assist poor Students who may require assistance, and who shall have commended themselves by their exemplary conduct, although their abilities and acquirements may not qualify them to be successful competitors for an open scholarship.

TERMS.—On or before the last day of May, in every year, the College Board shall nominate two students, in their third term, at the least, whom they may deem best qualified, having regard to their poverty and the excellence of their characters; and the President shall forthwith transmit their names, together with a brief statement of their claims, to the Visitor, who shall select one of them to be the Exhibitioner, and
