Paris Designers are Trying Out All Sorts of Ideas-- So Take Your Choice of the Tight or Full Skirt



I have been coming to Paris I have never known the minds of the great designers to be so untried. They are trying all sorts of ideas on the public.

The beautiful straight lines are dying hard, but the French manufacturers have been finding so much fault with designs that only use a little cloth that the big fashion houses are trying to help them out.

By the way, did you ever notice how many things we women are blamed for that are not our faults at all? We are always blamed more or less for the fashions of the day.

Our likes and dislikes have nothing to do with it. The manufacturer and the merchant decide what we shall wear.

The first one is a modern notion of a Greek idea, and its simplicity and grace appeal to me much more than the fussiness of the other. This gown is for ceremonial occasions, and notwithstanding its artistic merit it could be made by the amateur dressmaker.

Two kinds of material are used—crepe meteor and satin charmeuse of a soft mother-of-pearl color.

The body of the gown is of the crepe meteor, with the band trimming of the charmeuse in the same shade, the difference in material making a pleasing variety. Although this gown has horizontal trimming, it suggests height. The scooped front is a graceful touch, and the long under sleeves are sure to be a design that will be worn all winter.

The dress is of stone gray marquisette laid over a patterned foulard in dull blue-violet. The satin trimmings and the deep satin "hem" also have a deep gray violet cast.

Between these two extremes of fashion there are all the steps. So you see that this is to be a season of transition with the odds in favor of the full skirt and what is called the normal belt line for our spring clothes. Don't you dread it? I do!

Others on the Same Track.

It appears that the first clue to sensitized virus-vaccine was received through experiments made with a mixture of serum and living bacilli. The experimenters wished to see what effect the serum would have upon the bacilli when the bacilli were introduced simultaneously into a living organism. They discovered that the effect was practically that of serum without its deadly living companion. Later experiment failed to show any particular advantage over the older method, for the same objection was found, namely, that sufficient immunity was not created. Finally, the experiment was made of introducing the living bacilli under certain conditions, and the results are as stated. It is well to bear in mind that many very noted experimenters have long been dissatisfied with present vaccination methods, and some of them have been dropping toward the goal which appears to have been first arrived at by Metchnikoff and his assistants in the Pasteur Institute.

A New System For Preventing Typhoid

Metchnikoff's Theory.

Vaccination against typhoid is no new thing, says the Mail and Empire. It has been used in the British Army in India for many years with good results, and it is also compulsory in the United States Army. To vaccination is believed to be due the fact that the last year there were only a dozen cases of typhoid in the whole American army. There is, nevertheless, a very strong prejudice in some quarters against vaccination, whether for smallpox or typhoid, and this prejudice is by no means without first-class medical support. It is easy to imagine, therefore, the sort of opposition that will meet the latest scientific proposal from the Pasteur Institute, which is to the effect that we should be vaccinated against typhoid not by a lifeless vaccine, but by living bacteria. All the serums at present in use are made of lifeless organisms. They are dead germs. The Pasteur idea is that the germs should be live, and that a man to ward off typhoid should have injected into his veins living and aggressive typhoid germs.

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BOOK SWINDLERS CLEAR \$5,000,000 BY FAKE SCHEME

New York, Dec. 4.—A gigantic fraud in de luxe editions, alleged to have netted nearly \$5,000,000 to the conspirators, was charged in an indictment returned by the Federal grand jury against James J. Farmer, president of the Anglo-American Authors' Association; Glen Farmer, his son and star salesman, and ten other men.

Thus far only four arrests have been made. James J. Farmer and Glen Farmer were held in \$5,000 bail each while "Colonel" William J. Hartley and William H. Scott, who have acted as salesmen, furnished \$2,500 bail each after surrendering to the post-office inspectors.

The indictment, which charged using the mails to defraud in a scheme to sell de luxe editions, was the outcome of a civil action brought recently in the United States District Court by Mrs. Emma Bird, a rich widow of South Lake City, Utah. Mrs. Bird obtained a verdict from the jury for \$42,977 against Farmer and his company, on alleged "fake" volumes which he had purchased for \$45,000. The disclosures made during the trial of Mrs. Bird's action led to an investigation by the Federal authorities which unveiled the alleged gigantic fraud now charged.

Testimony of book experts who were called on behalf of Mrs. Bird showed that the books sold by the Farmer concern were worth only one-fifth to one-tenth of the prices charged.

It is believed the operations of the swindlers netted much more than \$5,000,000, the Government's original estimate of their receipts.

In addition to the names of rich men and women made public by various suits to recover money, the Federal authorities have found evidence of many more, who have lost from \$5,000 to \$20,000, but who have kept their misfortunes to themselves, rather than face the publicity of litigation.

The commonest method was to represent to a prospective customer that an American millionaire, travelling abroad, would buy a certain collection at an enormous figure as soon as the collection could be gathered together. If, therefore, a certain sum was advanced to secure an option on the collection, the books would be resold immediately at a handsome profit.
