

MAY WEAK SPOTS IN FOSTERITE FINANCING A LIFETIME OF

CONCLUSION OF ABLE SPEECH

BY THE HON. J. D. M. BAXTER

Government's Attempt to Squeeze Lumber Interests—Price, Waterhouse & Co., Not Infallible—The Seed Fiasco—Provincial Secretary was hard on Premier on Valley Railway Criticism—The Extravagant Amateurs at Fredericton.

Fredericton, April 10.—Continuing his mastery address in the debate on the budget in the legislature on Tuesday evening, which, owing to pressure on space the Standard was unable to print in full yesterday morning, Hon. J. D. M. Baxter referring to the auditor general's report at page 44 dealt with the statement in the consolidated revenue fund account which showed that bonds aggregating \$857,500 had been sold and credited to that account. If that entry meant anything, it meant that the bonds were sold at par but on reference to page 41 it was found that the net proceeds of these bonds, the amount the province really received was but \$835,010, the difference between the two sums being \$22,490. That sum would appear in the accounts as a discount, the speaker claimed, but it did not so appear. If the whole amount was to be credited as receipts the cost of floating the bonds should appear as a discount for the opposition had frequently been told that this government had nothing to conceal but desired to make a full and free statement on all transactions. He wondered why Price, Waterhouse & Co., the financial advisors of the government, had allowed this blunder to pass.

Squeezing Lumbermen.

There were many other items in the accounts that could be criticized at length. In the estimate of receipts, the Provincial Secretary had told the house that he did not expect there would be any larger lumber cut this year than formerly. There might not be a larger cut but the government had been indulging in a process of increasing the stumpage and the idea of which seemed to be to see how much money the government could get out of the lumbermen without decreasing its majority to the vanishing point. It was a race between the financial needs of the government and political expediency, and expediency had come out ahead. Some remarks had been made tending to disparage the old government in connection with the matter of territorial revenue. The administration of which he had been a member had revoked a plan by which stumpage had been fixed for a term of years. The present government owed this to the former administration which had opened the door in that direction. Referring to the provincial liquor law he said that he believed every town and municipality should pay its portion of the general cost of administration and not think that the law for the enforcement of the law within its own boundaries and should receive the fines from that law. There was a question on in St. John today in reference to this and he doubted whether the present system was the best.

Sale of Seed.

Regarding the expected revenue from the sale of seed he said the government seemed to be very optimistic concerning it. They estimated that they would receive \$105,000 and get that much back as well as \$5,000 for seed sold in the last year. If that item was administered the same as it had been at year the province would not get half the cost of seed. Last year had been a fiasco and he had no more faith in the ability of the agricultural department in the coming year than he had in the past.

The government had also taken in at revenue the whole of an amount of \$5,500 due from the New Brunswick Power Company for running rights over the bridge over the Reversing Falls at St. John. This was not right. At least \$5,500 of that sum was due to back years and should be credited to them as not more than \$2,000 would accrue this year. Yet the government took it all in as revenue expected during the present year. One of the items laid down by Price, Waterhouse & Co., was that all revenues and expenditures should be credited or charged to the year in which they became due. But the government in its treatment of this bill had acted contrary to the advice given them.

Railway Earnings.

On the matter of railway earnings the government expected to receive \$100,000. This, he thought, rather justified the faith of the people who launched the Valley Railway project. The provincial secretary had indulged in criticism of the Valley Railway, but the speaker wondered if he knew at whom he was really striking in his remarks. When the Valley Railway proposals were first before the house the honorable member for Moncton city had a seat here and had abundant opportunity to protest against the proposal if he deemed wise. But he did not do so. The Provincial Secretary was also hitting at the speaker, for in the days of Valley Railway agitation in St. John no one had been more active in support of the proposal than had Mr. Foster. The speaker said he felt sure that the road must eventually be taken over by the Dominion Government and then that government would have

Hon. Mr. Speaker.—The member has a right to ask a question. Mr. Murray again began to speak, but was called to order by the speaker. Blaming to a point of order, he objected that the minister of public works had used a dictatorial tone in addressing the hon. member. Mr. Guphill continuing said that two of the islands contributed to the motor vehicle tax, and he felt that they should receive some portion of the expenditure. He was opposed to the idea of developing trunk roads. He felt that the money should be laid out on by roads to enable the farmers to haul their produce to market instead of building trunk roads for the use of automobiles. He liked the plan in use in Maine, where localities may secure permanent roads by contributing an amount equal to a state grant.

The Valley Railway.

Referring to the Valley Railway he feared that before long it would take the whole revenue of the province to pay interest on bonds. He was glad to hear that the Federal Government might soon take over this railway.

He thought bond issues should be kept down, but if there is only \$85,000 left of the amount received from the proceeds of bonds issued for permanent road work last year he did not see how much further permanent road work could be done without another bond issue. The Minister of Public Works had asked him to mention the amount spent in the islands on ordinary roads. He found that part of the ordinary road expenditures had been left over from the year before and so he was not able to judge accurately how much had been spent during the last year.

Mr. Robichaud.

Mr. Robichaud felt that it was his duty to participate in the debate. When the whole world was plunged in the greatest perplexity of civilization it was better to find the people of New Brunswick involved in questions which are of supreme interest to the human race. The people were seized of the gravity of the situation and were responding to the call of the hour with a patriotism second to none, by responding to the immediate needs of the allies in whatever shape or form the people were showing the best stamp of patriotism. It was the duty of the government to prepare means for the future welfare of the people, as it should not be forgotten that the great war would have its consequences and bad. How could we expect the same conditions to prevail in the future as we had in the past? How could we expect to exist in the future as we did before the war? He believed that the destiny and the future of the province would arise from the depths to which

they had been carried by this conflict and attain a higher degree of civilization. He could see where the 30th century would eliminate into greater achievements would consist not of great inventions, but a complete reformation of the human conscience. The people of New Brunswick would have to keep pace with the rest of the world and to do so they must rise from the depths to which political and social desecrations had carried them in the past and live for higher ideals. There should be no more room for dishonesty in public life, and when he spoke of political dishonesty, he did not mean the political abuse, such as the misappropriation of public money, but he embraced those who were so weak as to make unpatriotic political capital. He wished to warn the public press of the province as well as a few of the public men that there should not be any room in New Brunswick for minds which attempt to create ill feeling between the different elements of the population. He had been pleased to hear the hon. leader of the opposition whom he admired for his broadness and fairness of mind, state from his place in the house that he had no control over the press of the province, but he hoped the hon. gentleman would put a stop to certain utterances made by newspapers supporting the party of which he was the leader. Such utterances could do his party no good and were a dangerous menace to the welfare to the people as a unit. All should remember that the key to success in this province was unity among the different races constituting the population.

Acadians Loyal.

They should remember that all were living under the same conditions and all boasted of being true and loyal British subjects. Speaking for the one hundred thousand Acadians of the province he could assure the House that their greatest aim was to live in perfect harmony with other nationalists and creeds. The loyalty of the Acadians to the empire was just as sacred to them as their faith and as sacred as their love for their venerable tongue. He could well remember when he had learned on his mother's knee to honor his God, he had also learned to honor as a beloved mother "La Bonne Reine Victoire."

Mr. Young.

Mr. Young said the financial situation had been dealt with fully by the provincial secretary. If the picture of the province's financial condition was as black as he had painted it, it was time the members of the government got together and made a determined effort to raise the province out of the slough. There had been mistakes by the old government, but they had been the result of honest error. That administration had handled fairly and

down. In his (Young's) own district there was a superintendent who was a man of his own kind and well fitted to handle men, but he was not a success as a road builder. The mistake had been in dismissing the old and competent road builders.

Mr. Young continued that free seed should be distributed. It might be urged that the finances of the province would not permit of free distribution of seed and if the minister would have enough to pay for it. Other departments were also over manned. He had gone into the public works department and found it so crowded that some officials had to go out when he entered. The patriotic fund assessments of \$24,000 was not necessary. If the government needed the money for current revenue, it should have taken the people into its confidence. The York County council would have to borrow money to make up its allotment, as it had provided only for its proportion of \$40,000.

In conclusion the speaker urged strongly the free distribution of seed grain. He knew that a large number of small farmers would be unable to plant unless the seed were given them. He knew of one merchant in Stanley, a supporter of the government, who had not been paid for seed grain for almost a year ago, and who on that account could not furnish grain at all this spring.

The debate was continued by Mr. Burehill, after which adjournment was moved by Mr. Pinder and made order of day for tomorrow. The House then went into committee with Mr. Leger (West), in the chair and agreed to the audit act, also to a bill to assist in carrying out the objects of the Canadian Patriotic Fund and to amend an act relating to the town Newcastle. Adjourned at 11:30 p.m.
