Fascism in Chile: genocide feared

MONTREAL (CUP) - The present economic policies of General Pinochet's fascist government in Chile can only mean genocide, according to Orlando Letelier, Minister of National Defense during the 1973 military coup in the Allende Socialist government.

Letelier, who was expelled from Chile after almost a year in concentration camps, is now teaching Third World economics at the American University in Washington, D.C.

In a lecture at McGill Un. iversity January 29 he describ. ed the regime as the most bruta in history, engaging in the most flagrant violations of human rights. The military junta ad ministers concentration camps still containing 8,000 political prisoners, he said, and the junt lost support from the middle classes "with the total failured their economic policies."

World Bank figures indicate the Chilean gross domesti product declined 19% in 1975 while industrial production declined 25%. Inflation - th main grievance of the junta reached 375.8% in 1974 "Wage earners are able purchase only 58% of what they could in 1970," whil "minimum wage now stands a \$12 a month.

Under the Allende govern ment, university enrolment in creased by 30% a year. The present regime has replace courses in politics and social sciences with ones in national security, he said. Many text books have been banned an 22,000 students have bee dismissed for political reason

Letelier said there is strong possibility dissatisfied generals "who refuse to be use as repressive instruments by minority class in Chile" wou soon oust General Pinochet.

When asked to describ methods to fight the junta Letelier said it was difficult tob specific when "there is mos probably a CIA agent in this room.


