Under Secretary of State.

I want to leave as soon after the First of September as transportation is available. I would like to embark on a liner of the Canadian Pacific Railway at Montreal and some time around the lith of September would be suitable to me.

I might say that I am quite satisfied that I can comply with the conditions laid down in the letter from the Director Auxiliary Territorial Service. I have had a thorough examination by a Doctor who is experienced in examining recruits for the Active Service Force and he assures me that I am perfectly fit in every way. I can also furnish the references that are required.

I sincerely hope that you will facilitate the permit.

Please be sure to send the enclosed letter and telegram back to me just as soon as they have served your purpose because I will naturally need to present them when I arrive in London.
