
Ottawa, 12th July, 1904.

Sir,-

A communication has been received from Messrs. Loveland & Stone, Lumber Manufacturers, Saginaw, Mich., in which they request the consent of this Department for the construction, by the Canadian Pacific Railway, of a spur from the main line of the said Railway to their lumber yard, situated in the Serpent River Indian Reserve, District of Algoma, Ont.

With reference to this request, it would appear that your company may proceed under the provisions of Section 175 of the Railway Act, 1903. This Department has no objection to any action your company may think proper to take under the said Section. The question of compensation for the land and damages thereto will as usual be considered at the proper time, when your plans have been received.
