I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your lette of the 16th ultime, with reference to your claim for the ment of notes given by certain Indians at Komsack for the purchase price of horses which you sold to them, and note your observation that the Indian Agent paid the sum of \$190 on account and that this should be proof that the Department approved of the deal, and you suggest that this is a just debt by the Government.

In reply I beg to say that this is in my sense s debt by the Government, it is a debt due by the individual Indians to whem you sold the horses. The Department had no knowledge of these transactions, and the Agent had no authorit to become responsible for any such accounts. The approval of the sale of these horses by the Agent would not amount to a guarantee for the payment, but if the Agent did undertake to become responsible for the payment of these notes, your clair should be against him personally and not against the Departme
