though they were so desperately needed by Britain, in order that they might defend themselves against a peril which would become irresistible once the peoples of the British Isles were vanquished.

During the last three months, unsurpassed in the history of Britain, it has become increasingly clear that German mentality has never really understood the British people.

Once again, the men and women of the British Isles have revealed their dauntless courage and their ability to fight, and to endure when their freedom is endangered.

Like Cromwell's Ironsides "they know for what they fight".

When we reflect upon the improved position in the Mediterranean, almost unbelievable three months ago; when we recall the transfer of the American destroyers; the enormous increase in war materials which are flowing from the United States and Canada to the island fortress; when in addition to witnessing the fruits of Canadian planning, we have also the certainty of the continuance of the policy of all possible aid to Britain confirmed by the vote of the American people, how can anyone come to feel, in the light of these facts, not the confidential property of the government, but all a matter of public knowledge, that the situation is more serious today than it was three
