ORIGIN OF THE ANGELUS. Some Data About the Custom That Makes Millet's Great Painting of Much Greater Interest.

Some interesting facts relating to the origin of the Angelus were related at Rome recently by Mgr. Esser, secretary of the congregation of the index.

The first clear documentary proof of the custom comes from Hungary (diocess of Grau), and dates from the year 1307. In 1317 the practice was common in Montpellier, in France, and the following year Popo John XXII, granted an indulgence to all who took part in the devotion in the Church of Saints. In a lew years the practice was generally obto all who took part in the devotion in the Church of Saints. In a lew years the practice was generally observed in Spain, England and Germany, and in the year 1327 the same Pope ordained that a bell should ring the Angelus in one church of every rione or district in the Eternal City at nightfall, granting an indulgence of ten days to all good Romans who recited the angelical saluation.

The ringing of the Angelus in the morning became common in less than a century after the practice of ringing it in the evening had taken root. As far back as 1380 a bell used to be rung at noon at Prague to remind the people to pray in honor of the five wounds, but the first notice we have of the midday Angelus comes from Imola in 1506.
