Mr. Hutton was kind enough to drive us out to the farm of Mr. Glenn E. White, who is doing excellent work in the official line. He is an Ohio man and brought a strong foundation with him for a Holstein herd. At Edmonton Mr. McIlroy's, private enterprise to Hon. Duncan Marshall, and Mr. John Blue, Provincial Librarian, treated us to a very pleasant motor trip covering the greater part of the growing season to the Alberta Exhibition. Good Dairyfarming in Saskatchewan. At Moose Jaw Mr. B. H. Thomson of Boharm, arranged for a visit to the breeders in that district. This is a leading dairy country where all kinds of cow feeds can be grown, including alfalfa and corn, and there is practically nothing in the way of cattle to be seen in the winter. Mr. Thomson has a grand herd, and is bred and cared for, and as he is doing both and yearly tests he is bound to occupy a large place in Saskatchewan. We expect at an early date to see Mr. Thomson, acting secretary of the provincial branch. He is young, capable and energetic, and no better selection could be made. We had a nice meeting, and special notice at Moose Jaw and were welcomed by a number of most and best of them by Mayor Pascoe and other prominent officials of the city and district. Among the best visitors to those of the district were John A. Thomson, a large dairyman, Mr. A. Mahary, President of the Grain Growers' Association and Mr. Johnson, neighbor of Mr. B. H. Thomson, who also accompanied us on our trip.

At Regina we met the Minister of Agriculture, Hon. W. R. Motherwell, the Deputy Minister, Mr. A. F. Meath, the Chief Stock Commissioner, Mr. J. C. Smith and the Dairy Commissioner, Mr. W. A. Wilton. Mr. Smith, who supervises all official test work for Saskatchewan, is undertaking to buy in the East and ship

out at cost pure bred or grade Holsteins ordered by farmers in this province. Many cattle are being brought in this manner and Holsteins are most frequently asked for. The Royalton type of Holsteins is adapted to dairying and is in demand in a market for milk. Holsteins are imported from the East to this province.

At Winnipeg Exhibition we got in touch with the leading breeders of Manitoba and found that there was a good demand for Holsteins in this province, provided the financial requirements of the breeders are taking care. Several new breeders are taking care. Mr. J. D. McGrover, of Brandon, famous for his Angus velders, but an enthusiastic Holstein dairyman, has a very fine herd of animals having already harvested his crops and provided for the winter. Mr. White, manager of the Grain Growers' Supply Co., has a good farm at Tatoo, and is starting in with a Holstein herd. We expect him to do well, as he is a young, active and capable. Another new breeder is Mr. H. D. Mewburn, M.P.P., an active business man. The Ontario veteran, Mr. George B. Brown, is now near at Stonewall, and he will be no exception to the ranks of the Manitoba breeders.

The Black and Whites outnumbered all other breeds at the Exhibition and their quality was excellent. In the dairy test held at Calgary, Holsteins were always first. In company with Mr. W. Cumming we interviewed Hon. George Lawrence, Minister of Agriculture, and were assured of his complete support of the Association in providing Manitoba farmers with good Holsteins. Mr. Cumming, who is the most extensive of the Holsteins in Manitoba at present and a very enthusiastic one, spared no pains to make our stay in Winnipeg a pleasant and profitable one. Mr. Hicks declares his own Western hosts ever come down to visit us in Ontario we shall feel his ability to provide the generous hospitality we met with everywhere in the West.
