A valuable historical volume of great importance compiled from MSS. in the State Paper Department of the Public Record Office, and contains, "Regi of the names of all ye passinger wch passed by ye Port London for on whole yeare endinge Xpmas, 1635." A booke of entrie for passengers by ye Commission e souldiers according to the statute passing beyond the seas begun at Christmas, 1631, and ending at Christmas, 1632. Lists of the living and dead in Virginia, February 16, 1623. Musters of the inhabitants in Virginia, 1624-5. Register of persons about to passe into foreigne partes March, 1637, to the 29th day of S. by vertu of a commission granted to Mr. Thomas Mayhew, gentleman. "Convicted Rebels" of Monmouth's Rebellion sent to the Barbadoes and other plantations in America. These interesting records are made up of emigrants, religious exiles, political rebels, serving men sold for a term of years, apprentices, children stolen, maidens pressed, and containing their ages, the localities where they formerly resided in England, the names of the ships in which they embarked, etc. There is also a good index of above 70 pages.
