THE LAURIE MEMORIAL TRUST SCHOLARSHIP

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination will be held of candidates who desire to obtain a scholarship under this trust, enabling them to pursue a course in Divinity at King's College, Windsor, and to proceed to a degree. The value of the scholarship is \$120.00 per annum, and it may be held for four years. The conditions of the scholarship are as follows: (1) "Applicants for a scholarship shall declare in writing that they are truly called of God to the Ministry of His Church through the leading of His Holy Spirit." (2) Applicants are required to give their unfeigned assent in writing to the following Bvangelical principles of the Church of England: (a) The Bible is the sole rule of faith; (b) Justification is by faith alone; (c) The sole and exclusive priesthood of Jesus Christ; (d) The presence of Christ in the heart of the worthy recipient in the Holy Communion and not in the elements; (e) Th: one mediator and confessor Jesus Christ; (3) Applicants must sign a declaration: "That they accept without mental evasion or equivocation of any kind, the principles of the Protestant Reformation as set forth in the formularies of the Church of England, and that they will resist to their utmost any effort from any quarter to pervert her teaching or to introduce into her services the practices of the Church of Rome."

An examination will be held in October next, on a date to be announced. Applications should be made to the undersigned, from whom a list of Text Books may be obtained.
