

Fires, so far as the said Laws relate to the Town of Fredericton, and to make regulations more suitable to the said Town---

I. *Be it therefore enacted by the President, Council, and Assembly,* That the Act passed

in the fifty-seventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled, "An Act for appointing Firewards in

"in the Towns of Fredericton and St. An-

"drews; and ascertaining their power and

"duty, and more effectually to prevent fires

"in the said Towns;" and also an Act pass-

ed in the second year of the Reign of His

present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the

"better extinguishing Fires which may hap-

"pen in the Towns of Fredericton and St.

"Andrews;" and also an Act passed in the

third year of the same Reign, intituled, "An

"Act in addition to an Act, intituled, "An

"Act for the better extinguishing Fires

"which may happen in the Towns of Fre-

"dericton and Saint Andrews;" also an Act

passed in the fourth year of the same Reign,

intituled, "An Act to amend an Act, intit-

led, "An Act for the better extinguishing

"Fires which may happen in the Towns of

"Fredericton and St. Andrews," be, and the

same are hereby repealed, so far as relates to

the Town of Fredericton.

II. *And be it further enacted,* That the Go-

vernour or Commander-in-Chief for the time

being, is hereby authorized and empowered,

by and with the advice of His Majesty's

Council, from time to time, by warrant un-

der his hand and seal, to appoint a sufficient

number of prudent and discreet persons, not

exceed-
