Bill for Lottery

The Bill for raifing a Sum of Money by a Lottery of Lotteries, for the building Bridges and making Roads of Communication through the Province,

paſs'd.

Was read a 3d Time,

Resolved, That the said Bill do pass;

Message to the

Order'd, That it be fent to His Majesty's Council, with a Message, that this House doth desire their Concurrence to the same: And that His Excellency the Governor may be requested to forward the said Bill to England, with the humble Request of the General Assembly to His Majesty, that he will please to give his Assent thereto.

Conference defired by the Council. His Majesty's Council, by Message, desired a Conference, by Committee, on the Subject Matter of the Bill for granting a Tax on Lands, and a Committee of this House was appointed for that Purpose.

According to Order,

and for additional Impost on Beer, & Impost on Cyder, and Lost Sugar,

A Bill for granting to His Majesty a Duty of Excise on Teas, Coffee, and Playing Cards, and a Bill for granting to His Majesty an additional Duty of Impost on Beer, and a Duty of Impost on Cyder, and Loaf Sugar imported into this Province,

Were presented to the House, and the same were read a 1st Time.

Order'd, That the faid Bills do lie on the Table.

His Majesty's Council acquainted the House by Message, that they had agreed to the Bill to enable the several Counties within this Province to raise Money for Payment of their Representatives.

Then the House adjourn'd till To-morrow Morning.
