" lader Currie, and the re-appropriating #100 heretofore granted for the " erection of a Church in Chatham, which are not agreed to."

And then Mr. Black withdrew.

Mr. H. Peters resumed the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Mr. Peters, from the Committee, reported, that they had gone into consideration of the business referred to them, and that he was directed by the Committee to report, that they had made several resolutions, which he read, and delivered them in at the Clerk's table, where being again severally read, were agreed to by the House, and are as follow:---

Resolved, that there be granted to Martin Chapman, the sum of ± 19 10 0, to remunerate him for exploring and surveying a new road from the Bend of the Peticodiac River to Fredericton, with a plan of the same, over and above the grant for that service.

To His Honor the President or Commander-in-Chief, the sum of $\pounds 192$ 10 0, to defray the expences incurred the last year in exploring a rout for a Canal from the Bay of Fundy to Chediac.

To the Commissioners appointed for enlarging and improving the Province Hall, the sum of #370, for defraying the amount due on the contracts for erecting the Surveyor General's office, and raising and inclosing the Wings to the Province Hall.

To His Honor the President or Commander-in-Chief, the sum of ± 45 5 2, being the amount of expence incurred in securing the Secretary's office, in the year 1822.

To the Secretary of the Province, the sum of #7850, for issuing 313 Warrants at 5s. each, between the 23d day of February, 1822, and the 6th day of March, 1823; and the further sum of #84100, for issuing 338 Warrants, between the 6th day of March, 1823, and the 26th day of February, 1824.

To John Patterson, the sum of $\pounds 124$ 4 7, amount of transient duty paid by him on sundry importations of West-India produce---no part of the said produce having been landed in this Province.

To John Patterson, the sum of $\neq 33$ 14 0, for drawback on 60 hhds. molasses and 32 bbls, sugar, imported in the schooner Union, Hobbs, Master, satisfactory proof being produced by him of the exportation of the same.

To John Patterson, the sum of $\pounds 40$, or such sum as will be sufficient to cancel a Bond given by him for duties on a cargo of run, sugar, and molasses, imported in the brig Robert, Palmeter, Master, from Trinidad, in Sept. 1823, satisfactory proof having been produced by him of the exportation of the same.

To the Governor and Trustees of the College of New-Brunswick, for the present year, the sum of 275, in further aid and support of the Grammar School at Fredericton.

To Thomas C. Lee, Esquire, the sum of $\neq 8$ 8 0, being a balance due to him by the Province, as Supervisor for the Western District.

To William M. Hazen, the sum of $\neq 8$, for his services in exploring on the Nerepis road, in the spring of 1823, by order of the Executive.

To His Honor the President or Commander-in-Chief, the sum of #3750, to pay John Abrams, a Tidewaiter at the Port of St. John, for his services in 1823.

To Geo. K. Lugrin, the sum of $\neq 80$, for printing the daily Journals of the Assembly.
