Prompt Steps Taken in Ox ord County to Check Outbreak.

INGERSOLL, July 13-As a result of the prompt and thorough investigation conducted by Inspector Dr Tennant of London, there is little danger of a further spread of hog cholera in Dereham Township, where there

was an outbreak last week. The investigation was concluded today, when the official announcement was made that in three days between 380 and 400 hogs had been killed. In

all cases they were shot. The hogs destroyed included all of the animals brought into the district recently from Western Canada. The premises of 20 owners haev been quar-

antined, which will prevent them from keeping hogs for three months. Several of the farmers have suffered comparatively heavy financial loss.
