SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

A NY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be home-steaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section of 100 acres, more or less

or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, he made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plane.

(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three

years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity, task homesteader may perform his own residents. such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father to
