At 11 o'clock on Tuesday-Armistice Day-the whistle at Wright's wood-working mill was blown, in order to call a complete cessation of activities on the part of citizens, in recognition of the sacrifice made by our brave boys who gave their lives in the great world-war. The call was pretty generally complied with, but as no public notice had been given a number did not know what the whistle meant and went on with their work as usual. This is to be regretted. The custom is a good one and should be perpetuated. Every year when the 11th of November comes around our people should be thus reminded of the debt they owe and can never pay.

The parliamentary session which closed at Ottawa on Monday was unique in many particulars. Called for a distinct purpo accomplished, members were preparing to disperse when the government introduced legislation that added 8,000 miles of railway to the government system. This was followed by a special committee of the soldiers' civil re-establishment system and resulted in a further expenditure of \$50,000,000 for this purpose.
