AFTER THE SHAH.

Teheran, Sept. 27.—A petition signed by high officials and the commanders of the army was presented to the Shah yesterday to the effect that unless the Sovereign accepts without reserve and will act according to the demands of a constitutional government, they will resign in a body from the service.

The foreign population of Egypt is less than 200,000. The greater part of it is to be found in Alexandria and Cairo, and in the other towns of the Nile valley, as well as in the Suez and Port Said.
