

LONDON, To-day. The Committee stage bill to amend the Irish Home Rule Bill, opened today in the House of Lords and will occupy three days. The first Unionist amendment to eliminate the clause providing for a vote to be taken in each county in Ulster on the question whether it should be excluded from the operation of the Home Rule Bill,

was carried by 158 against 35. The amendment moved by Lansdowne, providing for the total exclusion of Ulster without a time limit, was next adopted, 138 to 39. Lansdowne, referring to Marquis of Crewe's challenge, said that the Opster's exclusion would prevent civil war. 
