## Household Notes.

Growing children should have a  
great deal of milk in their diet.  
Delicious gums can be made with  
mashed potatoes and barley flour.  
Breadcrumbs are better than crack-  
er crumbs for frying oysters.

Two-thirds quinces to one-third  
cranberries makes a delicious jelly.  
Pickled oysters are a pleasant  
change from fried or stewed oysters.

When the quince jelly does not jelly,  
cook the syrup with a slice of lemon.  
Apples are delicious baked in a  
casserole with maple sugar and water.  
Large fruits should be served cold,  
but chilling readers small fruits more  
acid.

Salt should not be added to soup  
until it is done, because it hardens the  
water.
