Notice to Milk Dealers.

The attention of milk dealers is called to the following sections of the Regulations respecting the Production and Sale of Milk:

1. No person shall sell, or offer or expose for sale within the District of St. John's, any milk or cream without having first obtained a license from the Medical Health Officer.

2. All licenses shall be for the period of one year, commencing on the first day of June in each year. Licenses shall be granted free of charge.

Any person selling milk or cream without a license is liable to a penalty not exceeding, one hundred dollars, or in default of payment, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days.


