The Recent Appointments.

Our readers already know that the new Government, on entering office, discovered that their predecessors had made, during the preceding few weeks, nearly one hundred appointments to office, keeping them secret from the public and Parliament to the last moment. They do not know, however, that the list embraces, not only two Lientenant-Governors, several judges, and other officials appointed to fill actual vacancies, but a numerous body selected for places which will not, by law, come into existence till January next, and to occupy lighthouses not yet built! It is also now ascertained that during the whole of the late eventual session, down to the moment when Sir John A. Macdonald announced his resignation had been accepted, Messrs. Tilley and Crawford occupied their seats as members of Parliament, they all the while having virtually accepted the office of Lieutent-Governor; their commissions bear date 21st October. This was a direct and flagrant violation of the independence of Parliament.

As regards the public action of the new Government on these appointments, we are not as yet able to give any information. The tenure of office of Lieutenant-Governors and of Judges is different from that of inferior placemen, and all cannot be treated in the same way; but we doubt not that the Ministry will seek to correct, by every means within their reach, the assumption of undue authority by their predecessors.—Globe.
