IN THE POLITICAL FIELD.

South Ontario Liberals Renominate Hon. John Dryden-Notes. Mr. S. A. Netler, of North Pelham, has

been offered the P. P. A. nomination for Monck. A convention of the Liberal party of South Bruce was held at Formosa on Saturday, and adjourned until May 10.

WHITBY, April 29 .- South Ontario Liberals met in convention at the town hall here yesterday afternoon and unanimously nominated Hon. John Dryden, Minister of Agriculture, for election to the Legislative Assembly. Every polling subdivision throughout the riding was represented. In accepting the nomination Mr. Dryden spoke for an hour. At a mass meeting which followed the nominating convention, and which filled the hall to its fullest capacity, the Hon. A. S. Hardy, Commissioner of Crown Lands, made a splendid speech. A COUNTY TREASURER'S EVIDENCE.

George Graham, treasurer of the county of Peel, was a witness called by the fees commission recently. He said he had been 26 years in the office now held by him. He was decidedly in favor of the present system of appointment to office by the Government, on whom the responsibility of the general administration of justice should rest. He did not regard the office of sheriff and registrar, or kindred offices, as in any sense municipal, and advised the payment of officers by fees, as at present. In his own country, and in other of the smaller counties in the Province, he considered insufficient the incomes received by the sheriffs and registrars, He believed that the remuneration obtained by the sheriff of Peel was altogether inadequate, as during the past year he had received less than \$800. Where the fees of any particular office amounted to more than would give an adequate income he thought the surplus should be used to supplement the incomes of officers who were not sufficiently recompensed. He was of opinion that appointment by county council or election by the people would result in the selection of inferior men. Those who were best fitted for the offices were not likely to possess the qualities that would make them successful in securing popular support. Mr. Graham was opposed to the introduction of the system employed in the United States.

WANT NO CHANGE OF FLAG. TORONTO, April 29 .- The meeting of the Reformers of the north riding of Toronto, in St. Paul's Hall, for the purpose of organizing an association for this constituency, was a highly successful one, both in point of numbers and in the spirit of harmony, which manifested. A feature of the meeting was the able speech of Mr. Evanturel, M. P. P. for Prescott. In the course of his remarks he said there was room in this vast Dominion for all. He pointed out the fact that in Ontario the Protestant Church had made vast strides, while the Roman Catholic had stood still, and he considered it absurd that an overwhelming majority of the people should be alarmed at the minority, which had neither the inclination nor the power to injure it. He considered that all questions of race and religion should be let severely alone, as they were in the United States. He pointed out how Great Britain had grown in power and greatness with the different elements which constituted her people, and the different languages which were spoken in Wales, Ireland and the Scottish Highlands from that spoken in England. The secret of England's greatness was that she had found a place for all these divers elements. He said the French race had no desire to change the flag which they were now under for another
