Carnegie's Hero Fund.

Committee Makes Public Result of Its Investigation of Many Cases.

Honor Roll Long One Chronically Many Deeds of Bravery.

Ship Laborer of Quebec Given Silver Medal for Most Daring Rescue.

Pittsburg, Oct. 16.—The Carnegie hero fund commission tonight made public the result of its investigation of cases which were supposed to entitle the participants to recognition. Ten awards were made, as follows:

Daniel Davis, a coal miner, aged 23, of Sherodville, Ohio, lost his life in the rescue of his brother-in-law, William Munroe. His wife was awarded a silver medal and \$1,000. On July 11, 1904, William Munroe, having charge of the steam and electric pumps of the Somers Mining company in the Sherodville, Ohio, section, was overcome by gas in the old slope of the mine, and Davis attempted to rescue him. Munroe was saved, but Davis died on being brought to the outside.

Walsh Plummer, aged 15, on May 9, 1904, on Lynch's river, near Lamar, S. C., saved a companion, John H. Gibson, from drowning by jumping into the water and supporting him until he was rescued.

Miss Maud Titus, aged 16, a student of Newark, N. J., was awarded a silver medal for saving from drowning Miss Laura V. Bellinger, aged 27, a music teacher of East Orange, N. J., on July 10, 1904. When returning from a cruise on Lake Erie, the two girls were thrown into deep water by the upsetting of their boat. Miss Titus rescued her companion until help arrived.

Miss Anna Margaret Cunningham, aged 21, a nurse at the Savannah hospital, was awarded a silver medal for saving from drowning Ralph Young (colored), aged 19, a laborer, by jumping into the water and supporting him until he was rescued.

CARNEGIE TECHNICAL SCHOOL.
