

THE LAND BILL IN THE HOUSE. LONDON, July 20.—In the commons, clause 12 of the land bill has been aban-doned, and clauses 15 and 27 were passed. Gladstone said two of the land commis-sioners were appointed for seven years, in order that parliament might have an oppor-tunity to review the constitution of the land commission.
