### FLEMING RE-ELECTED MAYOR

**HIS MAJORITY EXCEEDS THREE THOUSAND.**

Mr. Fleming was elected Mayor of Toronto for 1893 by a sweeping majority. The vote polled, although the fact that yesterday was a holiday and an ideal voting day led to the belief that more voters would exercise their franchise than in any previous Mayoral election in this city.

Very little excitement was manifested and no considerable amount was expended on wages. Early in the contest, and in fact up to the last day, Fleming was a pronounced favorite in the betting. But the general opinion was that the contest would be a close one.

The press collected the returns at Richmond Hall, and as fast as they arrived they were published in various organs. The first to arrive were from the polling booths in No. 3 Ward, and when it was found that his vote had fallen 200 below that of Mr. Olesin that was it was generally conceded that Fleming had been re-elected. As the returns from No. 2, 4, 5, and 6 arrived, showing majorities for Fleming at every polling booth, it settled into a question as to what the majority would be. There were several surprises in the wards.
