Children Leave School Too Soon GUARANTEED RELIEF

In an address before the College and High School section of the Ontario Educational Association, Dr. F. W. Merchant, B. A., dealt with the question of State-controlled education. So far as organization was concerned, he said, the schools in Canada compared satisfactorily with those elsewhere, but organization was not everything, and unless the attendance was satisfactory, failure was bound to result.

From thirty-five to forty per cent of the children dropped out of school before in the control of the control o

children dropped out of school before admission to the fourth form, and from likely to occur again, eighty to eighty-five per cent did not reach entrance examination standing.
