White Winter has been sold for delivery in store at \$1.05, but now only taken at \$1.05. BARLEY. Nothing doing. Peas have been selling at 87 c per 63 lbs. for delivery in store. Lower prices however, are anticipated, especially if there should be any advance in freights to England. PORK—is dull. Anything doing purely of a retail character, and prices to some extent nominal. ASHES—have been steady. Heavy tars have sold at \$5.00, but now held at \$5.52 to \$5.55 for both Pots and Pearls.

In Leather, there has been little doing, and prices are in the main unaltered.

In Boots and Shoes, orders have been coming in freely, but they are for the most part limited in bulk. Buyers exhibit a good deal of caution in ordering and manufacturers are also careful as to extending credit. Prices are tending upward.
