Sm,-As your paper is the vehicle of thought expressed very freely about the usage of the 11th Battalion Argenteuil Rangers while in camp at Laprairie, with reference to deliciency and bad quality of rations, I beg to say that I have the authority of several of the officers to give an emphatic denial to such calumnies. With regard to bread, each man was served daily with a pound and a half of the very best quality; beef- one pound of excellent quality, in-stead of being "in marchingorder," as stat-ed in your paper. The only single instance of complaint about the beef was on one occasion when it was served at six in the morning as usual. The cook had allowed it to be exposed to the sun for a few hours before cooking. All the rest of the rations were in full cuantity and of excellent quality, except that on one single occasion the tea was infector. Your correspondent of the 11th seems anxious about the qualifications of the Quarter-master of the Argenteuil Rangers. I beg to say, no the authority of several officers, that he was a most efficient Quarter-master, and that there was not a single complaint against his while in camp. Instead of complaints from the Argenteull Ringers about short rations, they received little extras, supplied by Lieut. Col. 
