The Canada had 120 passengers, 40 for Halifax.—Among the latter we are glad to see several Engineers for the projected Railroad, whose head quarters we understand are to be at Halifax. This looks well.

The Prospectus of the "Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada" has been published. This is intended to amalgamate all the B. N. American Companies, having 964 miles of Railway to complete, and a combined capital of £9,600,000.

By the next mail we may expect to hear of the Royal Assent to the Bills passed by our Legislature.
