CANADIAN HOME INSULATION PROGRAMME

Question No. 130—Mr. Munro (Esquimalt-Saanich):

1. Is the Canadian Home Insulation Programme (CHIP) available to residents in all the provinces and, if not, which provinces are excluded and for what reason?

2. In what city is CHIP Headquarters and in what constituency is it located?
3. Who is the Member of Parliament for the constituency?
4. What Minister is responsible for the CHIP Programme?

Hon. André Ouellet (Minister of State for Urban Affairs): I am advised as follows by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation: 1. The Canadian Home Insulation Programme is available to the residents of all provinces and territories with the exception of Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia. A more generous programme has been in effect in these two provinces since February 1977, because they are highly dependent on imported oil for electricity generation and for home heating.

2. CHIP Headquarters are located in the Town of Mount Royal, in the Constituency of Mount Royal, in a building where CMHC has occupied space since January 1963 and where vacant space was available.
