Dear General Currie,

In reply to your letter of the 12th ultimo about certain exhibits which you wished to have from the Army Medical Museum for the McGill Centenary, I have been in communication with Colonel Brereton and have arranged for him to take certain things he wants. He tells me that he does not want anything from the Imperial War Museum. In any case, owing to the absence of the Trustees from London at the present time, I am afraid it would be impracticable to obtain permission for anything to be taken from there <sup>later</sup> in time for despatch to the Exhibition.
