though not an alumnus, a man who has carried a mountain load of responsibility throughout the days of war when supplies and shipping were cut off, and yet the whole mission looked to him for support.

"One of our girls tours among the villages of India with her little company of native Christian assistants. Another, married, is with her husband in the heart of the great mass movement where entire villages agree together to break their idols and learn the Gospel.

"Our Alumni in Persia lived through the days of terror and famine that the war brought in unceasing ministry and unsparing devotion to their helpless flock.

"China and India have our two women physicians still in service, though we gave India at least one earlier. A Y.W.C.A. traveling secretary joined the forces in India last year. We have a Y.M.C.A. secretary in Peking and the first of all our Alumni to make the "Y" his life vocation has been in Siberia for more than a year visiting every large city and even so far east as Ekaterinburg in Russia on the King's business."

Space prevents telling of our representatives scores of whom he mentioned by name and who are working in South and Central America and the Islands of the Sea. As country after country was visited and the leading part taken by a Park representative was told, or their sacrifices mentioned, it seemed almost like a continuation of the eleventh chapter of Hebrews.

And then these former students, the majority of whom have voluntarily given up their opportunity for using their trained minds for commercial or professional pursuits for personal gains have, out of their limited means, given this great sum for a new Science Hall. Many new suits have been given up in order that the gift might be sent. Many are wearing old hats a little longer to add to a gift already made in sacrifice. This building when completed will continually bear testimony to the spirit which underlies the principle on which Park is founded. The spirit of living for others—sacrifice.
