PATROLMAN IS FOUND

GUILTY OF EXTORTION

NEW YORK, April 18.—(Can. Press)

The second trial of a member of the police force for grafting resulted in the conviction of Patrolman Thomas F. Robinson on the charge of extorting "protection" money from a restaurant keeper. Robinson, it is alleged, was graft collector for former Inspector Dennis Sweeney, now awaiting trial on thirteen separate accusations. Another patrolman who served under Sweeney is now serving a term in Sing Sing prison for perjury himself, to protect his former superior and his friends against the district attorney's vice crusade.

Robinson was accused of taking \$60 a month from Ludovico Tancredi as the price of permitting his cafe to remain open.
