TRADE WAS DULL AT CATTLE MARKET

Receipts of live stock were 50 cars, comprising 400 cattle, 1485 hogs, 518 sheep and lambs, and 170 calves. Trade was again dull for cattle. In fact it was the slowest day of the week. Buyers had it all their own way practically speaking, and prices were no better as for good, as on Wednesday, the market closing with about two hundred cattle unsold, sheep, lambs and calves were about the same as on Wednesday.

Good butchers' cattle sold at \$6.50 to \$6.85; medium, at \$6 to \$6.50; common, at \$5.25 to \$6; choice cows, \$5.50 to \$5.75; good cows, \$5 to \$5.50; medium cows, \$4 to \$5; common cows, \$3 to \$4; bulls, at \$4.50 to \$5.
