**MORAN USED SMALL SQUAD.**

Patrick J. Moran, the host of the world's series, dealt an awful lot to the theory that a whole army of athletes are necessary to win a pennant. The Quaker chief had his team out in front all season, and he used only twenty-three players. Weiser, an outfielder from the North Carolina League, was the only rookie retained after the season had started. Additions to the team after the championship season started were the pair of pitching Georges-Chalmers and McQuillan. One has to have back to 1916 to find a National League team that won the flag with as small a roster as the Phillies of the present year. Then the Cubs employed twenty-three players. When Frank Leroy Chance captured his second banner, in 1907, the Bruins numbered twenty-four, and when he landed his third flag, in 1908, he had twenty-six players. In 1910, the last year of the Chicagoans' greatness, twenty-seven men drew stipends from Taft, Murphy & Co. between the opening and closing dates of the championship season. Pittsburgh finished first in 1909, with twenty-nine players. The number of men on the roster in 1911, 1912 and 1913 was respectively twenty-eight, twenty-eight and thirty-two. George Tweedy Stallings, in 1914, was the last manager to have over thirty-four men on his roster.
