## SIR,

Erewith inclosed, purfuant to the Defire of the Lords of the Admiralty, you receive a Copy of the Orders fent by the Governor and Committee of the Hudson's-Bay Company, to their Chief and Council at Prince of Wales's Fort, Churchill River, North America ; That in Cafe Captain Middleton (who is going abroad in the Government's Service, to difcover a Paffage to the North-weft) should, by inevitable Neceffity be brought into real Diffrefs and Danger of his Life, or the Lofs of his Majefty's Ships under his Command, and by that Means forced to the faid Fort, To give him the best Affistance and Relief they can, a Duplicate of which has been delivered to Captain Middleton : The Governor and Committee humbly crave Leave to reprefent to their Lordships, that in Cafe Captain Middleton should by any Means be detained or hindered from Entering the Straits early enough, to purfue the intended Expedition of a Difcovery before the End of the Year, or that by any other Caufe whatever (except by reaion of the Diftrefs before mentioned) he be inclined to Sail to and Winter in any of the Company's Factories; The Governor and Company apprehend the fame will be the Deftruction of their Trade and Factories, and will occafion the Natives to go and Trade with the French, who are very Watchful, and let no Opportunity flip of drawing and enticing the Natives away, and hindering them from Trading at the Company's Factories, and thereby the Company will run the utmost Hazard of loofing their Trade, which if once loft, or a Distaste or Affront be given to the Natives, it will be with great Difficulty, if ever
