

DESPERATE PRISONERS KNOCK TURNKEY DOWN

Tried to Escape, But Governor of Jail Appeared on Scene and Foiled Their Attempt.

CHATHAM, July 4.-Arthur Smith of Knox, Penn., and Edwin Baldwin of Wainsfield, Ohio, to-day made a sensational and desperate attempt to break jail, in which the turnkey, Christopher Somerville, nearly lost his life at the hands of the men. Both men were arrested on Tuesday
