The "Big Seven."

Louisville, Ky., Feb. 27.—The Circuit Court Grand Jury returned indictments at noon to-day against J. M. McKnight, president of the German National Bank; Sterling B. Edmunds, politician, and Aldermen R. E. King, C. E. Jenne John E. Leatherman R. O. Brener, N. J. Frick and F. A. Britt, members of the combine known as the "Big Seven." The other member, Alderman J. W. Reeder, escaped by turning State's evidence. One indictment charges all with conspiracy to defraud the public. Alderman F. A. Britt was also indicted for receiving a bribe of \$2000 from President McKnight of the German National Bank; and an indetment was returned against McKnight for bribing Britt. The joint indictment against McKnight, Edmunds and the six aldermen charges that they combined with Alderman J. W. Reeder and other "wicked and corrupt" persons to pass laws which would procure the sale of the Louisville water works, whereby they would make \$1,000,000 for themselves. The grand jury declined to indict Mayor George D. Todd on the charge of bribing members of the Council to secure his election.




