

out of, or be incident to, a particular manufacture, trade or calling? If such necessity may grow out of, or be incident to, particular manufacture, trade or calling, do the words "works of ne-cessity" apply exclusively to the doing on the Lord's Day of that without which the particular manufacture, trade or calling cannot successfully be carried on during the remaining six days of the week? Some 30 corporations were notified by Mr. Paterson of the proceedings, including the Street Rallway and the Ferry Company and other such concerns, and some were represented by counsel. Mr. Paterson devoted most of his time to proving the province's right to legislate in the matter, holding that an infringe-ment of the Lord's Day Act was not a criminal offence, and, therefore, not within the Dominion Parliament's exclusive juris-diction. He held that breaking the Sab-hath and offences against religion were entirely different; that "criminal" neces-sarily applied to the whole community, while the law in question applied to people sarily applied to the whole community, while the law in question applied to people who are carrying on their ordinary business. For instance, he could sell on the street on Sunday, or a barber could sell goods on Sunday, and a merchant could shave, and not come under the act: therefore, it was not a criminal law, being applicable only to sections of the community. The argument will be taken up again this morning, and is likely to proceed all of some interested parties to oppose the arguments.
