**GERMAN PRESS HAS SOME  
HOT WORDS FOR DEWEY**  
Admiral's Remarks Reflecting on  
Kaiser's Navy Causes Considerable Ill-Feeling.

Berlin, March 29.—The German Foreign Office officials say they do not believe that a diplomatic incident will result from the recent interview with Admiral Dewey published in a newspaper of New York, N. Y., and containing references to the German navy and German Emperor.

The officials say they are reluctant to believe that the admiral was corrected, "especially in view of the good-will he showed towards Germany in the messages exchanged with Prince Henry." The Foreign Office officials add that should the interview turn out to be true, it "would prove somewhat disturbing to the pleasant relations with the United States." No official information on the subject has been received from Washington.
