The department in a circular has called attention to the terrapin scale, in consequence of its wide range of food plants, including both wild and cultivated trees, as a dangerous pest, "which may be controlled, but never eradicated." Small, parasitic, fourwinged flies are the greatest benefactors in the control of this insect, and Dakotas indicate that only 50 per cent of the crop is in there, and the shortage will be at least 25 per cent.
