> Lorneville, Ont., Aug. 20 .- At a U. F. O. picnic here today the Hydro radial situation was dealt with by A. A. Powers, president of the United Farmers' Co-operative Company, in vindication of the government appointing a commission inquiry. Mr. Pow-ers said there was a scarcity of in-formation before the people on the Hydro Commission's scheme. Munici-palities had accepted estimates that were high as to cost of construc-






