RUSSIA APPEALS TO POLAND FOR LOYALTY IN WAR

LONDON, Aug. 15, 8 a. m.—A despatch to Reuters' Telegram Company from St. Petersburg says that Grand Duke Nicholas, commander-in-chief of the Russian army, has addressed a manifesto to Poland, appealing for the loyalty of the Poles and promising them autonomy in return. The manifesto reads: "The hour has sounded when the sacred dream of your fathers may be realized. A hundred and fifty years ago the living body of Poland was torn to pieces but her soul survives and she lived in hope that for the Polish people would come an hour of regeneration and reconciliation with Russia."

WANT TO KNOW WHY CENSORSHIP STAYS
