Rulers of the Little Central American Republics Fear a Spanking at the Hands of Their Big Brother to the North.

Panama, July 22.—Central Americans who are now in Panama and who are greatly interested in the situation brought about by the revolutionary movement in Honduras, are convined that the Presidents of several of the republies are involved in the affair, the ramifications of which reach far back.

According to one of the most prominent of these Central Americans, President Calaya, of Nicaragua, to be the promoter, conceived a plan for Zelaya's downfall. Fearing that without aid he could not succeed in this, he endeavore! to interest his eighbor, President Figueroa, and money to Dr. Prudencio Alfaro for the purpose of invading Salvador.

For a time President Figueroa was undecided, but eventually General Manuel Bonilla, ex-President for Honduras, whose sades by Zelaya, appeared on the scene He recommended that they begin operations by replacing him as Presicent of Honduras, this merely as a priminary step; later all three republics, Honduras, Guatemala and Salvador, he suggested, could join forces in an attack upon Nicaragua.
