The affairs of the School are under the control of Mr. R. Norman, who, with the aid of his competent wife, takes charge of the boys, superintends their physical and moral training and looks after the welfare of the School.

Mr. W. T. Kennedy still continues his evening classes at the School, and his report herewith submitted testifies to the advantages derived by the boys from their training in this department.

The thanks of the Board are due to Dr. Lindsay for his care and oversight of the health of the School.

In closing this report, the Board of Directors desire to acknowledge their gratitude to a kind Providence in that the needs and requirements of this School have been impressed upon the minds of those whom He has blessed with wealth, and who have at their death provided for these needs and requirements by legacies to the School.

The Board regret that the immediate needs of the establishment absorbed the funds which they would otherwise have invested as a permanent endowment; but they feel confident that, with the enlarged usefulness now opening out to the School, with increased efficiency and with a more general public support, they will be able to carry on the work successfully, and in the future set aside legacies towards the formation of an endowment fund.
