The military medal, won in France, was presented to Private J. J. Doran of the 26th Battalion, yesterday morning.

Brigadier-General H. H. McLean read the orders which awarded the medal and he handed the decoration to Mrs. F. H. Cortwright, wife of the senior major of the 177th Battalion, and she pinned it on Private Doran's breast.

Private Doran, who had been awarded the Military Medal by His Majesty George V., was heartily cheered, as was Private Doran.

## Maine Will Give Aid to Farmers

The State of Maine will loan its credit to farmers in need of financial aid to secure feed and fertilizer. Such a course will be taken only in the most urgent cases. This action was decided upon at a conference between Governor Milliken, the executive council, Hon. Harold M. Sewall, chairman of the state committee on public safety, and Hon. John E. Bunker, executive secretary of the committee.

The executive secretary was directed to take immediate steps to discover all possible sources of supply outside the state for seeds of staple farm products and for commercial fertilizers in carload lots.

The committee was also urged to proceed with all possible speed for the completion of the census of farm resources, which is now underway. It is hoped that this census when completed will show possible increase of acreage in each community and also determine the need for extra seeds, fertilizers and financial resources to accomplish the desired results.

The governor and council are trying to work out a plan for direct financial assistance, to supplement the resources of local business men and bankers in giving aid to farmers in especially urgent cases. The information which this census will furnish is urgently needed by the governor and council to aid in working out this plan.

It was the unanimous opinion of those present at the conference that direct financial aid in the way of loans to farmers on the part of the state for seeds of staple farm products and for commercial fertilizers in carload lots.

The committee was also urged to proceed with all possible speed for the completion of the census of farm resources, which is now underway.
