**FEARS HUSBAND
PREFERS SISTER;
SO MURDERS HER**

Woman of 80 Calmly Con-
fesses Her Crime—Husband
Noticed Her Jealousy.

Long Branch, N. J., Jan. 21.—Mrs. Hermione Rentman, thirty, arrested in her home in an isolated section, calmly confessed to the police that she had shot and killed her sister, Germaine Westcott, twenty-seven, as she lay sleeping in Sunday morning because she feared that the younger woman was stealing the love of her husband, Frederick Rentman, a chauffeur.

"My sister tried to steal my husband, and I killed her," she told the police simply, without a trace of emotion. All day Sunday and Monday Mrs. Rentman sat by the bed on which lay the body of her sister. That night she wrote to her husband, who was in New York, telling him of the tragedy, and adding that she was about to kill their fourteen-month-old child and herself. Rentman received the letter and at once returned. Police detectives accompanied him to the house. They found Mrs. Rentman in the kitchen, busied with the evening meal. On seeing the police, she calmly motioned them to follow her and led the way to the bedroom. Her sister's body still lay on the bed.

Rentman explained that Miss Westcott came from Germany two months ago to make her home with them. She had been there but a few days, he told the police, when he noticed that his wife seemed extremely jealous of her sister.

TIFFIN MAYOR SELLS BREAD.

He Gives it to Citizens at Six Cents in Fight on Bakers.

Tiffin, Ohio, Jan. 21.—Continuing his fight against food profiteers and the high cost of living in Tiffin, Mayor Unger established three bread stores, two at fire stations and one in his automobile supply store here. Hundreds of loaves of bread were brought from Toledo bakers and are being retailed at six cents a pound loaf. Tiffin bread retails at eight cents.

Mayor Unger is buying the Toledo bread, wrapped and freight paid, at five cents. He declared he would use the cent profit to finance further inquiries to bring down the cost of living here. Opening of the municipal shops is the Mayor's first move to bring down prices here, and was taken when bakers refused to cut bread prices 25 per cent.

**DISCOVERS SON
AFTER 15 YEARS**

Boy was Kidnapped by His Father, a German Count, on Two Occasions.

Denver, Jan. 21.—After a separation of fifteen years, Mrs. W. O. Wood and her son, Karl Heinrich Greiff, were reunited here when the latter came from Germany, where he had been kept a virtual prisoner by his father for years. Mrs. Wood married Count Greiff, a German noble, nearly thirty years ago in Germany. She was a Viennese. When their son was four years old, the two became estranged and the parents separated. The count kidnapped the child and kept him for several years. Countess Greiff recovered her son, only to have him stolen again by her former husband within a month's time. This time his mother, despite all her efforts, was unable to find him. A few years ago she came to America, married W. O. Wood and came to Denver. In 1918, she learned through the Red Cross that her son, then in the German army, was in a hospital. Through the combined efforts of the Red Cross and Mrs. Wood, Greiff was able to leave Germany and come to Denver. Greiff, twenty-five, says he intends to remain in this country.

GOAT-RAISING IN B. C.

Pacific Coast Province Goats Number Five Thousand.

Goats in the Province of British Columbia now number approximately 5,000, according to a statement issued by the provincial department of agriculture. Practically all of these animals are of the Toggenburg, Saanen and Nubian breeds. When first introduced into British Columbia it was predicted that goats were but a passing fad, but such has not been the case, and today goat-raising occupies a recognized position in the livestock industry of the province. While no other province in the dominion has entered into this industry so extensively, the original foundation stock, numbering some 200 head, entered Canada in 1917 from the United States when they were examined by federal authorities and each animal tagged with a little metal plate stating that it was officially recognized by the government as foundation stock. In order to avoid confusion and to limit the registration of pedlars, all efforts have been concentrated on the three main breeds, Toggenburg, Saanen, Nubian, which are noted for their milk-producing qualities. The amount of milk produced by many of these goats is truly remarkable. Official records have been made of over 2,000 pounds per annum, and one animal is credited with a production of 2,941 pounds.

No laborious work is entailed by any owner in caring for a herd of goats. A snug and comfortable house, free from draughts and rain-proof, is all that is required for shelter. A good-sized yard is necessary for the animals to browse in. In feeding, leaves of all kinds, broom, wild berries, and practically all kinds of grass are relished by them, as well as es, who keep one or two in the backyard or on a nearby vacant piece of land. They are milked twice a day at regular hours, and thrice if the goat is heavy milker. The income from milk alone in the province last year amounted to \$15,000, representing 74,450 gallons. In addition, butter and cheese can be made from the milk, but experiments have proven that the quality of these products is not up to the standard of that made from cow's milk, and as a result there is no market.

A goat breeder's statement was formed in British Columbia in 1917, with a membership of 176, which has increased annually until at the present time the number is well over 400. Another society, known as the Canadian Goat Society, has also been formed for the purpose of registering pedigree goats.


There is a continual demand for goats in British Columbia, where the climatic conditions and abundance of natural feed make the province an ideal one for the raising of these animals. In time it is probable that the other provinces, inspired by the success which has attended the efforts of breeders in British Columbia, will also take up this form of livestock, and in the meantime no efforts are being spared to make the Pacific province the leading goat-raising territory on the continent.


