



ROCKEFELLER HAS GIVEN \$130,000,000 TO EDUCATION

Cambridge, Mass., May 2.—John D. Rockefeller has given \$130,000,000 in the last twenty years for the advancement of education in the United States, said Dr. Wallace Buttrick, president of the General Education Board, in an address to the Harvard Teachers' Association.

Dr. Buttrick said that approximately \$75,000,000 had either been paid or promised to the country's colleges and universities.
